
# **NELP XI: Class Project**

The Nehemiah Emerging Leaders Program (NELP) is an innovative 10month professional development program engaging emerging leaders in a process to learn effective and ethical leadership skills to take back to their respective organizations and communities. CHI was honored to be chosen as Class XI's NELP Project this year.

In September, Class XI presented the Project reportout with their results. During the course of this year, the Class worked to build more brand awareness for Cottage Housing, spearheaded our Big Day of Giving Campaign, provided advocacy training for the Board of Directors, and interviewed staff, residents, and Board Members on their experiences, frustrations, and dreams for the future of the agency.
